



WELCOME OUR FRIEND JAMES

James was too polite to tell us whether he liked the

turkey he sampled for the first time at SPC's community Thanksgiving dinner in November 2018. It was the first of many new experiences. James had just settled into a new life in this country in Morgantown, WV. It was a long journey from his native Uganda.

In February 2018, he contacted

me on FaceBook to say he anticipated resettlement in Morgantown. I found the broad outlines of his story checked out and stayed in touch. In November, we met, and I brought him to the Thanksgiving dinner.

Uganda has seen virulent homophobia in recent years, in part inflamed by American evangelists. Although a law to make being gay punishable by death was struck down by the nation's supreme court, the social environment in the country remains intensely anti-LGBTQ; there are many acts of vigilante violence creating a climate of terror. That's the environment James found himself in when he applied for refugee status,

which was eventually granted after a vetting process that took about two years.

So, James found himself in a completely new country and community. He had one childhood friend, who preceded him by about two years and with whom Catholic Charities placed him. He's been keeping pretty busy. With refugee assistance being time-limited, and an obligation to repay his airfare, he quickly found an opportunity to train for a Certified Nursing Assistant program.

He's been trying new foods and taking pictures of those he likes the best since he can't remember their names. He's also been traveling a bit, getting to know his new country. He did ask us when it would start getting warm again. We said "March," to which he replied, "that long?" We hope he is finding it more to his liking!

We have invited James and his friend to Pride, Saturday, June 29. We hope you will visit the SPC booth at Pride and give them a warm welcome!

UNDERWEAR PROJECT: ASYLUM SEEKERS AT THE SOUTHERN US BORDER

SPC's Immigration and Refugee Support Committee has learned of a desperate need at a new port of entry in Laredo, TX. Most of the asylum seekers have been walking for weeks and have only the clothes they are wearing—and no shoelaces. They have no means to support themselves until they connect with a family member or sponsor in the US. Our colleagues at Catholic Charities, who recently worked in the Laredo center, have asked us for help.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- Donate socks, shoelaces, shampoo, deodorant, and underwear (ONLY new and in sizes for children and adult sizes small to medium). Bring them to the church until June 2 and they will be shipped to Laredo.
- **Donate money through June 2**. Make checks to SPC with "Laredo" in the memo.
- Send help directly to Laredo. Go to the Amazon link: https://smile.amazon.com/hz/wishlist/ls/Z7SL0RKRRE4T. Select from the Catholic Charities Wish List to send the items directly to Laredo.

SESSION REPORT

The Session, the governing body of SPC, met Thursday, May 16. It is working on a number of important matters which the Session wants to share with the congregation.

- Endorsed a proposal from the SPC Earth Care Committee on further action regarding SPC opposition to the Rockwool heavy industry plant, including an open letter to be shared with the congregation and the community. Than Hitt is our official spokesperson.
- Continued to put in place processes to cover all aspects of SPC's congregational life during this next chapter of transition. It has charged Ethel Hornbeck with coordinating worship and programmatic life during this period.
- Approved plans from the Property Committee to renovate the kitchen, and to identify and address issues raised by this project, such as handling the handicap access.
- Heard a report about upcoming plans for Pride Month, which is celebrated throughout June, when SPC will be hosting several events. (See front page.)
- Received report from the Immigrant and Refugee Support Committee about engaging the congregation in addressing urgent humanitarian needs at the border. (See Underwear Project article.)
