SERVICE MUSIC IN LENT: The Introit, Communion Response, and Blessing the Confirmands Response are from a typical northern Indian *bhajan*, a kind of spiritual song praising the attributes of God. The Response to the Prayer for The Fast refers to the meal at Emmaus shared by the Risen Christ and his two companions on the road. The Response to the Declaration was chosen as the official hymn of the 1976 International Eucharistic Congress. The Sending is from the Taizé community.

TODAY'S HYMNS: The text of the Opening Hymn was written by Gregory the Great in the 6th Century and paired with a 16th Century chorale melody from Germany. The Reflection Hymn evokes the interplay of present awareness and timeless meaning that accompanies the Eucharist.
