MUSIC IN WORSHIP: The late 20th Century Introit is from the Taizé community. The late 20th Century Opening Hymn reminds us the Spirit is both gentle and restless. The early 20th Century Response to the Prayer for Pentecost was inspired by the prophet Jeremiah. The late 20th Century Response to the Declaration is set to a folk melody. The Response to Blessing the World and First Pew was written for the Civil Rights movement in Chicag. The tune of the early 21st Century Sermon Hymn iwas composed in Singapore, named for the Maori phrase meaning "Holy Spirit," and written in New Zealand. The early 20th Century Sending was written by a Canadian father and daughter for her wedding.
