- We bought a water pump, a compressor for the dental clinic, new batteries and lamps for the solar lamps at PAX, new tires for our vehicle, a colposcope, a hematocrit machine, PPE for Covid protection and new gowns for nurses.
- We received donated N95 masks and a controller for the oxygen generator.
- Needy students received scholarships for their studies.
- Donations provided care for indigent patients.
- We have been able to maintain the hydroelectric facility.

We continue to find comfort and hope inspired by your kindness and generosity. The challenges are immense but we will remain steadfast through this crisis.

We are hopeful we will be able to see each other again soon without constraints. This festive period is an opportunity for special attention to the most fragile in our society and for those who surround them with care and dedication so they can live with dignity.
