WORLD PRIDE 2025 CALL TO ACTION: UNITED FOR JUSTICE, LIBERATION, JOY, AND LOVE. The PC(USA)'s Advocacy Committee on LGBTQIA+ Equity has signed the 2025 World Pride Call to Action, calling for people of faith to work towards collective liberation. "Let our faith be evident in the way we fight for each other, hold space for each other, and refuse to leave anyone behind."

MORAL MONDAY, JUNE 2, Rev. Tony Larson, Co-Moderator of the General Assembly of the PC(USA) will participate in the Moral Monday public witness event organized by Repairers of the Breach. Tony writes, "This sacred action is a bold response to an immoral budget and unjust policies that harm the poor, women, children, and workers. Grounded in Micah 6:8 and the prophetic tradition of justice and mercy, we will stand together to say No to oppression and Yes to love, justice and the sacred dignity of all. ... What happens with this legislation is literally a life and death matter for many in our nation."

JUBILEE 2025. The Presbyterian Washington Office joined partners from Adat Shalom, U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, Bread for the World, United Church of Christ, Pax Christi, and the Jubilee USA Network to call for debt relief and changes to the financial system to end global poverty.
