Aging Faithfully: Tea & Discussion, hosted by Diana Patterson; 2nd Sunday, October – May, 4-6pm, Classroom 1. Connections and contemplations for age 50 and older. Inspired by a book by Alice Fryling.

Bible at the Bar, hosted by Pastor Gusti and Adam Ware; monthly in October – May, in person at The Meck, drop in as you feel led. We will grab a table and dive into your questions about the Bible, theology, and anything else you want to discuss!

Dream-Tending As Spiritual Practice, hosted by Pastor Gusti; monthly October – May, in person, closed group of 8 people. Each person will be asked to present a dream as an invitation for group formation.

Grief Meets Grace, hosted by Pastor Gusti; monthly October – May, in person, drop in as you feel led. A light liturgy followed by shared conversation on where we might find grace through the many griefs we carry.

Teach the Preacher, hosted by Pastor Gusti; weekly in October – May, on Zoom, drop in as you feel led. Reflecting on your questions and comments around the Scripture lesson for the coming Sunday.

Pastoral Care General Overview

Pastor Gusti and the Deacon Shepherds have spent a significant amount of time in the past couple of years assessing the pastoral care needs of the congregation and clarifying the shared roles and responsibilities for pastoral care among Deacon Shepherds and the Pastor. Current Deacon Shepherds are: Cathy Cross, Paul Denchy (Secretary), Jena Jones, Ellie Lloyd, Mica Martin, Patti McCarthy, Chris Morehouse, Debbie Romano (Moderator), Derek Smith, Jeananne Stine, Carol Wood.

To aid the congregation in knowing who to contact for specific pastoral care concerns, we offer this general overview. Please do not hesitate to reach out to Deacon Moderator Debbie Romano or Pastor Gusti if you have questions, concerns, or comments on our work to-date, or if you need a reminder as to who your Deacon Shepherd is.

Role of Deacon Shepherd: Each member of the congregation has been assigned a Deacon Shepherd, who is responsible for ensuring the spiritual, emotional, and physical care and nurture of their "flock." For some members, this may entail regular "tending" in the form of phone calls, sending cards, general encouragement, ensuring physical needs are met, ensuring opportunities to engage and participate in church activities are clear. Some members may prefer to be "left alone" unless there is an emergency situation. You maintain full autonomy in determining how much, when, and if to share your needs with your assigned Deacon Shepherd. All conversations are kept confidential, unless you give explicit permission to share.

Parish Care Committee: The Parish Care Committee is responsible for coordinating care for physical needs (see below) and developing congregational education programs on various issues of care and concern. Contact **PAUL DENCHY**, **Moderator**, with ideas for educational programming.

<u>Physical Needs (Meals and Transportation)</u>: One crucial role of Deacon Shepherds is to ensure their flock has access to meals and/or transportation when necessary. **JEANANNE STINE** is our coordinator for these services in 2023 – 2024.

<u>Prayer Coordinator:</u> Manages the online PrayerNet, the bimonthly Prayer Gathering, the Distribution of Prayer Shawls, and the Prayers for the Pastor to share in Sunday worship. She is also available for individual prayer with any member who wishes. To share your prayers with the PrayerNet, join the PrayerNet yourself, and/or request a Prayer Shawl, contact **DEBBIE ROMANO**

<u>Shepherd for Animals</u>: CAROL WOOD has been commissioned as the Deacon Shepherd for Animals to remind us of the holiness they add to our lives. This includes a card ministry for those who have lost a dear companion Animal as well as celebrating those who have brought a new Animal to their home. It also includes support when an Animal's time has come for that last journey to the vet for euthanasia, be it driving the family to the vet's office or meeting them there to accompany them into the room where the procedure is performed if so desired.

<u>Role of Pastor</u>: PASTOR GUSTI offers the congregation training and experience in a broad spectrum of crisis intervention, short-term counseling (up to 3 sessions), and long-term spiritual direction (monthly reflection). This includes both short-term relationship counseling as well as developing life event rituals of various kinds for those who might be helped by them. Congregants whose spiritual/emotional needs exceed the capacity of their Deacon Shepherd to offer care are encouraged to contact the church office to schedule an appointment.

*The Session approved a 2023 budget with a sizable deficit, covered by reserves, due to increasing costs from inflation, a larger commitment to supporting external mission and advocacy, and investments in ministry with children and youth. The Session based these decisions on the information gathered during from the Congregational Assessment Tool and the Strategic Issues Team from 2016 – 2019. The 2024 Pledge Drive will invite the congregation to consider options for increasing congregational giving over the next 3 – 5 years in order to decrease reliance on reserves to fund these commitments.
