Pastor's Note: All Creation Waits

Every year I tell myself that this will be the year I embrace the true meaning of the Advent liturgical season: waiting, resting, reflecting, praying, contemplating, grieving, hibernating, seeking, trusting. All of the counter-cultural practices essential to Advent that go out the window when the busy-ness of Christmas preparations inevitably take over.

This year's Advent Worship Planning Team has sought to carve out space for these counter-cultural practices throughout the liturgical life of our community. Based on the children's book *All Creation Waits: The Advent Mystery of New Beginnings,* by Gayle Boss, our worship in December invites us into contemplative reflections through the darkness of rebirth. Chanting, Sentence Prayers, Extended Silence, and Simple Communion accompany stories of how various animals bed down for the winter. These stories show us how to adapt to the dark and cold in ingenious ways, trusting the God who comes, even in the darkest season, to bring us a new beginning.

Because Christmas Eve occurs on a Sunday this year, some of the treasured SPC traditions will need to be adjusted. Our "Prepare Ye" musical celebration with children and the nativity scene will take place at the conclusion of the 11am service on the *Third* Sunday of Advent: December 17. On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the morning of December 24, the early service will be suspended and there will be no Sunday Studio or Choir offering.

Our Christmas Eve services will continue as always: a 5pm Family Service with The Friendly Beasts; an 8pm Service of Lessons and Carols with the Choir; and an 11pm Contemplative Candlelight Communion Service. The 5pm and 8pm services will be livestreamed.

We are also experimenting this year with a special contemplative service, Wednesday, December 13, 7pm, in support of those for whom the season enhances feelings of loss and loneliness, or who simply need a space to escape from socially enforced celebration. This will officially launch our *Grief Meets Grace* monthly gathering (see pg 7). In order to maintain the privacy of the participants, this service will not be livestreamed.

Throughout the season, whether we are able to maintain our contemplative composure, or end up surrendering to busy-ness, or somewhere in between, may our liturgical life together cultivate a faithful hope, peace, joy and love amid it all.

That the several Trustees of Shepherdstown Presbyterian Church be authorized and directed to execute and deliver a Deed by which the Church will convey all of its right, title, and interest, both legal and equitable, at and for no consideration, to Contemporary American Theater Festival, Inc., a West Virginia non-profit corporation, in and to all that certain parcel of real estate situate in Shepherdstown Corporation District, fronting 206 feet on the south side of German Street and extending back (southerly) between parallel lines, 206 feet. *The Session approved a 2023 budget with a sizable deficit, covered by reserves, due to increasing costs from inflation, a larger commitment to supporting external mission and advocacy, investments in ministry with children and youth, and online worship tech support. The Session based these decisions on the information gathered from the Congregational Assessment Tool and the Strategic Issues Team from 2016 – 2019. The 2024 Pledge Drive invites the congregation to consider increased congregational giving by 5% per year over the next 5 years in order to decrease reliance on reserves to fund these commitments.
