In this book, Theoharis critically examines both the biblical text and the lived reality of the poor, to show how this passage is taken out of context and distorted. We look forward to some lively discussion each month around a topic that impacts so many in our state and around the world. The book is available on Amazon.

A Zoom connection is offered for anyone who cannot be with us in person, and drop-in participation is always welcome during the year, whether or not you have read that month's chapter. You will find coffee, snacks, thought-provoking conversation, connection with other women of the church, time for prayer, and a little group business at each meeting. Year-to-Date Budget at a Glance – as of May 31, 2024

The Session is pleased to report the congregation has stepped up generously in response to our request to increase pledges by 5% per year over the next five years. Total 2024 pledges as of January 20 are 2.5% above 2023 pledges. We will continue to encourage the congregation to give as generously as you are able. If you are able to increase your 2024 pledge even further, please do not hesitate to let the church office know. We are grateful for you!

* Based on the increase in 2024 Pledged Giving, the stability of our Reserves, and the frugality of congregational spending, the Session decided to continue its strategic investments, in spite of the sizable deficit, in external mission and advocacy, ministry and children and youth, and online worship tech support. This deficit will be covered by reserves, in the trust that congregational giving will continue to increase in the next four years.
