Pastor's Note: A Great Longing is Upon Us

October begins with World Communion Sunday and unfolds into a Season of Creation, accompanied by Stewardship Season at SPC, all wrapped up in a four-part series in response to a request for a sermon on forgiveness.

Through it all, a thread of longing runs: to live again in a world made of gifts.

These are the words of Robin Wall Kimmerer, enrolled citizen of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, botanist and author, with whom I had the privilege to study in August: *A great longing is upon us*, she says, *to live again in a world made of gifts*.

Musician Laurence Cole has set these words to music, in a chant that will introduce our worship each Sunday this month. Additional music, liturgy, and preaching on the themes of forgiveness, peacemaking, creation-affirmation, and table fellowship invite us to sing, pray, and speak the truth of our longing, even as that longing is fulfilled in the same act of worship.

In addition, we will participate in a Litany of Creation for three Sundays (October 8, 15, and 22) and a Litany of Youth Affirmation on October 29. Please come to worship each Sunday with a small container of the element of creation that is our focus for the day: October 8: earth; October 15: water (preferably from a natural source); October 22: plants. Perhaps the element will come from land on which you dwell, perhaps from a park or along the river. We will invite the children to combine their elements together during First Pew and engage the entire congregation in a Litany of Creation with the elements later in the service. Containers of elements will be provided for any children who are not able to bring their own.

As we recommit to Creation - and ourselves as *part* of Creation - we also re-commit ourselves to the care and flourishing of this community. Each member household will receive a Stewardship Letter and Pledge Form for 2024, highlighting our theme: *Keep the Faith, Mind the Gap*. Moments for Stewardship in worship throughout the month will highlight the impact of your pledges on our commitments to mission and advocacy, children and youth, worship technology, and equity in staff salaries and benefits. Please pledge as generously as you are able - up to a 5% increase if possible - to help build this long term vision for SPC.

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

PEACE & GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING: We will be collecting this offering through September. The envelopes are in the pews and on the tables in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. Please write "Peace Offering" in the Memo section. You can donate online as well, just indicate "Peacemaking" when doing so. 25% of the Offering stays with local congregations, and 25% with mid councils to unite congregations to support peacemaking in their regions. The remaining 50% is remitted to the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

STEWARDSHIP SEASON BEGINS! Each household will receive a Stewardship Letter and Pledge Form for 2024, highlighting our theme: *Keep the Faith, Mind the Gap*. The Session has made strategic investments in worship technology, children and youth ministry, staff benefits, and increased giving to mission and advocacy beyond the congregation. However, to maintain and build upon these investments into the future (and keep up with inflation), our total annual congregational giving needs to increase by \$45,000 - \$75,000 (15% - 25%). Please pledge as generously as you are able to help bridge the gap and build the long term vision.

A COMMITMENT TO "TITHING." In 2022, the Mission Committee asked the Session to prioritize external giving to mission and advocacy beyond the congregation as the "first fruits" of our budgeting process. In response, the Session directed a "Tithing Team" to review the biblical understanding of tithing, how tithing has been and continues to be practiced by individuals and congregation, and how the needs and values of SPC would impact our approach to "giving first." That team recommended, and the Session approved, moving toward a 10% tithe toward external giving by the 2024 budget. For Session purposes, the the concept of external giving includes the Mission Budget, the Social Justice Budget, Adult Education anti-racism programs, the Youth Mission Budget, and the Campus Ministry Budget (beyond the \$5000 gift from the Westminster Foundation).

*The Session approved a 2023 budget with a sizable deficit, covered by reserves, due to increasing costs from inflation, a larger commitment to supporting external mission and advocacy, investments in ministry with children and youth, and online worship tech support. The Session based these decisions on the information gathered from the Congregational Assessment Tool and the Strategic Issues Team from 2016 – 2019. The 2024 Pledge Drive invites the congregation to consider increased congregational giving by 5% per year over the next 5 years in order to decrease reliance on reserves to fund these commitments.
