The late 20th Century Opening Hymn is a summons to participate in God's desire for radical *shalom*. The late 20th Century Kyrie is a traditional liturgical text. The Alleluia is the refrain of a Muskogee Trail of Tears song. The late 20th Century Introduction and Response to the First Pew is a Harvest Hymn set to a familiar Welsh tune. While the Sermon Hymn is now associated primarily with the Civil Rights Movement of the mid-20th century, this African-American spiritual most likely dates from the Daves of the slave trade The Sending is a Guatemalan chant.
