A composer from Singapore sent this early 21st tune, named for a Maori phrase meaning "Holy Spirit," to the author (in New Zealand) to see what text it might inspire from her. The late 20th Century Response to the Prayer for Resurrection is from a contemporary setting of Psalm 96. The late 20th Century Response to the Declaration is from the Taizé Community. The Introduction and Response to the First Pew is a Brazilian folk song. The late 20th Century Sermon Hymn was written by an American author of Slovak descent. The Sending Hymn is a Guatemalan chant.
