# **Sung Response**

Based on input from the congregation, the SPC Session has adopted budget priorities for the near and mid-term future.

These budget priorities lead us to an annual budget of roughly \$390,000.

Last year's pledged income was \$242,000. Additional large one-time donations totaled \$80,000.

(Other sources of income include non-pledged general giving and building use giving)

We have enough money in reserves to maintain our annual budget for 2-3 years.

For the long term we need to increase our annual pledged income and major one-time donations by 5% per year.






