**TODAY’S CHORAL ANTHEM:** The origins of “This Little Light of Mine” are unclear. It likely emerged from African American oral tradition and was later arranged by gospel musician Harry Dixon Loes. It became a defining anthem of the U.S. Civil Rights Movement as a way to unify people during their fight against oppression. It assures us that we can all make an impact on the world, even with something that may seem small.

**TODAY’S HYMNS:** “Christ, Be Our Light” is a modern, justice oriented hymn written by Bernadette Farrell and first published in 1993. It emerged from Farrell’s long ministry in Catholic liturgy, community organizing, and social justice advocacy, and it quickly crossed denominational lines to become one of the most widely sung contemporary hymns in English speaking churches. “We Are Marching in the Light of God” is a lively Zulu/Xhosa freedom song that originated in a Methodist young men’s group in South Africa and has gone on to become popular in many other languages around the globe.
